Frequently asked questions

Will the Trail Ride take place rain or shine?

Yes! The Trail Ride will take place rain or shine. In the case of severe weather conditions, it may be necessary to modify events and activities. If there is a need to communicate changes, we will announce them on the homepage of our website and via email to all participants and volunteers.

Will there be water available?

Only for participants. Please bring your own from home for horses.

Can I bring my pet?

Service animals only are permitted at the event. Those bringing a service animal to the event should be prepared to clean up after the animal. Please do not leave animals in your car!

Will there be food available?

Yes. Complimentary food will be available for everyone following the ride.

There will be parking in the field at 80 Brown Road in Corinna.

As you approach there will be someone to direct you.

Requirements and safety

- Must present coggins, rabies certificates (recommended rhino and strangles vaccines). If you or your horse are exhibiting symptoms of any illness or have been exposed – please stay home.
- There will be a vet on site, any horse exhibiting signs of lameness or illness will be examined by the vet to determine if fit to ride/participate.
- Please bring your own water bucket and water for horse.
- Absolutely no smoking or alcohol use will be permitted.
- Stallions are not permitted.
- Stay on the marked trail. Pass only on the left.
- If you have any allergies or illnesses, notify others in your riding group.
- If horse or rider become injured, please call for help.
- Ride at the level/speed of the least experienced rider and the least experienced horse. Absolutely NO cantering or galloping.
- Communicate concerns clearly.
- Carry a cell phone on your body (not on your horse).
- Carry a trail map.
- All youth are required to wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets. Though helmets aren't required for adults, they are strongly recommended for all riders.
- Park only in designated areas.
- Always ask before passing and pass at a walk.
- Keep your muck in the trailer and dispose of it at home or in a designated area.
- If your horse exhibits behaviors which require special consideration you should tell all the members of the riding party about those issues and place a ribbon of appropriate color both in your horse's tail and mane. The following are common ribbon color codes:
Red = Kick Green = Novice
